

CHICKASAW NATION

Along the Tennessee River where Calvert City resides today was once owned by the Chickasaw Nation. In 1818 under General Andrew Jackson's Treaty of Longtown the US Government agreed to pay the Chickasaw's \$20,000 per year for 15 years in return for the Chickasaw's claim to the land.

Dr. John Howard, his brother, Stephen Howard, Matthew Kuykendall Sr., Mathew Kuykendall Jr., Josiah Kuykendall and Howard P. Kuykendall settled in 1822 after receiving land grants. Others who received land grants in this region were: the Calvert brothers — Willis Calvert, Potilla Willeford Calvert, and Wilson H. Calvert — Elisha Cox, James Draffen, J.W. Saling and Thomas Stringer. The Rev. D.M. Green, arrived a little later. In 1846, William Martin Freeman and Malinda Gibson McGee Freeman with their sons — Thomas Martin Freeman, 8, and Henry Clay Freeman, 2, and James Calvin McGee, 18 — sailed their flatboat down the Tennessee River and landed at the site where the Westlake, Lubrizol and Carbide plants now stand. William Martin Freeman received a massive land grant along the river.

HAYDOCK'S FERRY



Haydock's Ferry (now spelled Haddox Ferry) was established in 1836 and shaved off hours of travel time offering quicker transportation crossing the river in to Smithland. Gideon Haydock and Howard Kuykendall owned and operated the ferry as well as one of the first general stores in the area, Haydock & Ferguson. The settlement that became Calvert City escaped being burned to the ground when several hundred Union soldiers marched up the dirt road from (Haydock's) Ferry landing before daylight one July morning in 1864.

The Union men confronted Confederate forces and killed about 20 of them in the skirmish that ensued. The ferry was in operation until 1942.


OAKHILL



Potilla W. Calvert, a direct decedent of Baltimore's Lord Calvert received more than 2,000 acres in land grant along the Tennessee River and Big Cypress Creek. He married his first wife, Helen Wilson, in the summer of 1853 and began the construction of their home, Oak Hill, that was completed in the fall of 1860. Helen never saw the completed project. She died in 1858 leaving behind a young daughter named Helen. Just two years later, Calvert remarried in 1860 to Margaret Jane Carr. Calvert continued to live in Oak Hill until his death. He raised his family there and it was said that his home was always open for

dinner guests. The side yard of Oak Hill was used for croquet and yard tennis by all the children in the neighborhood. It still stands today on Aspen Street.

CALVERT DEPOT




Surveyors for the Paducah and Elizabethtown Railroad accepted Calvert's offer to donate right-of-way if the railroad would build a shipping station near his home. The depot in Calvert City brought life to a quiet river town. Passenger trains came through daily and life in Calvert City started to boom. Stores started popping up from families such as the Stringers, the Cox family, the Draffens, and the Sailings. Strawberries and tobacco were two of the main goods shipped out of the station.

On March 18, 1871, Calvert City was incorporated and John Taylor, a blacksmith, became the first mayor and Pete Summers, the first town Marshall.

LANDERS HOTEL



In the 1870's the Calvert brothers,
Potilla and Wilson, built a two-story
hotel fronting on Railroad Street. It
was acquired and operated by John
Lander. The vacant old landmark
burned in 1974 and is now the north
parking lot of the First Baptist Church.

STRINGER & COX



Among the city's early businesses was Saling and Cox owned by William J. Saling and Elisha Cox. The store burned destroying its inventory. Cox then joined a new enterprise with Thomas Stringer circa 1877 operating as Stringer & Cox. Stringer soon retired and Cox continued the business until his death in 1895. After Elisha's death, his son, Clarence Lee Cox, took control and ran the store until

his own death in 1950. The store fronted on Railroad Street (now Railroad Avenue) across from the railroad depot. The building, constructed in 1898, was destroyed by fire April 21, 1971, the city's centennial year. At the time it housed Handiwood Products Inc.


DRAFFEN FARM SUPPLY



George Luther Draffen was born on July 13, 1890, to John Henry Draffen and his wife, Susie Tibbs Draffen. When Luther was barely a teenager, he traveled to Paducah and got a job with Rechoff's Saddlery earning \$3 a week. He paid \$2.50 for room and board and after learning the trade, he moved back to Calvert City and opened his own harness repair shop in 1906. The next year, Luther's older brother, Mert, moved home from St. Louis and the two borrowed \$300 from their father and opened Draffen Brothers Farm Supply Company.

COMMUNITY TELEPHONE

A community telephone service was established in the early 1900s, providing a party-line phone service. The founders of the telephone service are unknown. Being on a party-line meant at least three households were connected by the same line. Every person on a party-line could listen to other customers' phone conversations. Phone lines were tacked to trees and fence posts in some areas of the city.

CALVERT BANK





Calvert City business leaders solved their lack of banking facility on September 16, 1907 when they organized Calvert Bank as a branch of Smithland Bank. R.F. Roark, L.S. Dees, John M. Tichenor, Dr. R.M. Jones, and J.H. Leckey comprised the board of directors. At a September 18, 1908 public meeting with the board of directors, the group decided to incorporate as an independent institution. Tichenor, Jones, Leckey, Holland and George M. DeHaven signed the Articles of Incorporation and applied for a charter. Joseph Hardy Little, H.P. Johnston, Dees, Roark, Jones, DeHaven, D.W. Larrett, Tichenor, J.W. Halstead and R.L. Holland were elected directors, with Halstead as president and Holland cashier. Halstead served 23 years as president. Stockholders erected the bank building in 1910 located on McLeod Street (now Aspen). In 1977 the bank building moved to its current location on 5th avenue and Cedar Street and is now owned by Community Financial Services Bank. Calvert Area Development Association purchased the bank building for \$15,000 in 2018 in an effort to preserve one of the oldest buildings in Calvert City.


CALVERT CITY HIGH SCHOOL

There were no schools in the community prior to 1868. That year, Jimmie Draffen, John Stringer and Elisha Cox started a public subscription education system. A log school house was built on what is now the corner of First Avenue and Main Street. Goober Smith was the first teacher. The second and third schools were built where First Baptist Church now stands on Ash Street. In 1900, a two-story frame building was erected near what is now North Ash Street where Draffen's Industrial Supply Warehouse stands.


In 1918, Lucy Foust started a drive to establish a high school. Her formula called for the town's citizens to pay 50 percent of the cost and the Marshall County Board of Education pay 50 percent. In the fall of 1919 Calvert City High School opened with a two-year program. Homer and Larrie Ford, parents of Dr. H.W. Ford were the first teachers.

Enrollment increased yearly, and the first high school class graduated from a four-year program in 1922. The building became inadequate in the late 1920's, and in 1930 a new brick building housed first through 12th grades until 1954 when Calvert City and Sharpe High Schools were consolidated to form North Marshall High School at Palma.


The Calvert City Building continued to be used by grades one through eight until about 1960 when the first wing of a new elementary school opened on 5th Avenue. Grades five through eight remained in the old building until the night of November 21, 1968 when the building burned. Classes for those grades were held in local churches until the second wing of the new elementary school opened.

CYPRESS SWAMP

The largest construction project of its time in Marshall County began in 1917, the drainage of Cypress Swamp. The big ditch began in a field just northeast of present day Draffenville and cut a path across the swamp to Gilbertsville, where it turned west and connected with Little Cypress Creek at a location between Calvert City and the Tennessee River. The boat in the photo was a dredge boat used in a portion of the construction of the ditch. On the boat are Wallace Noles and an unidentified friend.




TUBERCULOSIS OUTBREAK




Like many other communities across the nation in the 1920s and '40s, this region experienced a deadly outbreak of tuberculosis. Calvert City was fortunate to have a TB specialist living in Calvert City. Dr. William Thomas "W.T" Little, was an eminent TB specialist of his era. He was born on his family homeplace at Palma and graduated from Benton High School, Southern Normal University and the University of Louisville School of Medicine. In 1918, he graduated from the Army School of Tuberculosis at Greenleaf, Georgia.

He practiced from his home office on McLeod Street (now Aspen), a half block south of the rail depot. He also had an office in Paducah and practiced at the Illinois Central Hospital there. Dr. Little was the attending physician at hundreds of births in Calvert City and Gilbertsville throughout his career.








CALVERT THEATER

In 1939, Louis Hall built a theater on the west side of Main Street. Hall built the theater for W.C. Sullivan to operate at a cost of \$2,376. Luther and Mert Draffen owned the theater. It provided movie and stage entertainment for area citizens as they struggled with the hardships of the Great Depression.

Paul and Ruth Evelyn Harrington bought the theater from Shelby McCallum in 1950. The Harringtons moved from their home in Covington, Tennessee to Calvert City in 1954. They built the Calvert Drive-in Theater in 1953.

Ruth Evelyn Harrington, who turned 110 in 2021, still owns the drive-in and her son Steve is the chief executive officer. Mayor Gene Colburn proclaimed the date Evelyn Harrington Day in Calvert City on May 6. The Calvert Drive-in is one of less than 400 drive-in theaters remaining nationwide compared to over 4,000 that existed in the 1940s and 50s.



KY DAM "WORK" VILLAGE

Kentucky Dam Village State Resort Park has not always been a recreational destination. Initially it was constructed as a place for Tennessee Valley Authority (TVA) employees to live while building Kentucky Dam. The construction of most of the village took place between 1938-1939. It was occupied by TVA from construction to its transfer to the Commonwealth of Kentucky in 1949 and is now one of 45 state parks in Kentucky.

The dam village was a modern community. Each house had running water and electricity, rare conveniences for the area. The worker village was fully segregated with a section of the village set off for black employees located just north of the "white" village. Though some of the facilities located between the black and white villages allowed black patronage, blacks and whites were rigorously segregated within these common areas. The section of houses and buildings for black employees were removed after the completion of the dam; it is now an empty field.

TVA came offering good wages for over 5,000 workers, housing, and food for its employees. This was a time when poverty was high and the average farm income in the community was \$700 per year. The construction of Kentucky Dam not only changed Calvert City, it changed our region.

"The Village itself stands as a testament to more than just obvious accomplishment. It stands as evidence of the first stirrings of industrial values in an agrarian area, its modern ranch housing in contrast with the older farmhouses around it. It stands as an example of the potential of positive government action. And its empty fields attest to the shortcomings of these actions and as a warning not to forget the pitfalls of a much less egalitarian time in our history." – Bill Mulligan


NORMAN MILLING COMPANY

Robery Elias Norman and Lawrence Solomon owned and operated the Normon Milling Company in the 1930s. The mill was powered by a single cylinder 37.5 horsepower Fairbanks and Norse diesel engine. This powered the mill with alternating current electricity. The company was best known for its flour, called Nomco Flour. The flout was tested all the time by Mrs. Mofield and Mrs. Solomon.

In 1937, during the massive flood water reached the mill by roughly two inches. The sacks fermented and started a fire destroying the mill. After the flood water receded, Elias Normon went to work at his grocery store. He later sold the grocery store to Harrell's Grocery and bought a farm in Palma.

Despite determined lobbying by Luther Draffen, Calvert City had not persuaded Kentucky Utilities to provide the city with electricity. In 1932, Normon Milling Company installed a generator, ran electric lines, and began operation of an electric light plant. The plant provided electric lighting for businesses and hundreds of citizens. Eventually the company extended its lines to Gilbertsville. The plant continued to operate until the 1950s when Jackson Purchase Rural Electric Cooperative Corporation, now Jackson Purchase Energy, became the provider of electric power.







1937 FLOOD

There were not many good years in the 1930s. Times were hard across the United States and Calvert City was no different. William Roy Draffen, son of Mert and Jennie Draffen, remembered his family spending the night in his father's store while his father slept with a gun by his side.

The Great Depression was the worst economic downturn in the history of this country and then in 1937, the skies opened and it rained for 19 days. The rivers began to flood, homes and businesses north of the railroad were underwater and it was apparent that something needed to change.

Luther Draffen served as president of the Lower Tennessee Valley Association (LTVA) and lobbied hard to get a hydroelectric dam built on the lower Tennessee River. Luther turned his garage into a boatyard, where volun¬teers built a fleet of boats to rescue more than 2000 stranded flood victims and their livestock after the boat at Haydock's Ferry was swept away in the flood.

Old flood photos show water appearing several inches deep had seeped under the railroad and flooded Railroad Street in front of Draffen's Department Store.

That dream of a dam finally came to fruition on July 1, 1938, when Congress appropriated \$2.613 million for construction of Kentucky Dam.

KENTUCKY DAM

Kentucky Dam is 22 miles upstream from the confluence of the Tennessee River with the Ohio. The dam is the longest in the TVA system, and the reservoir—which stretches for 184 miles across Kentucky and Tennessee—is the largest in the eastern United States. On the tail-end of the Great Depression, the construction of the dam not only helped with the decades of flooding issues on farmer's land but also provided a boost in the local economy by providing roughly 5,000 jobs.

Because of Luther's persistence, the location of Kentucky Dam was placed just up the road from Calvert City instead of initial plans to build the dam near Aurora. Before the dam, thousands were leaving to find work in automobile factories in Detroit and Flint Michigan and Kentucky Dam brought in skilled laborers from all over the country. Many families relocated to Calvert City because of the opportunity to work at Kentucky Dam. The dam was completed on August 30, 1944 and generated electricity September 4.

Lower Tennessee Valley Authority (LTVA), led by Luther Draffen, was made up of roughly 40 business leaders from western Kentucky, northwest Tennessee, southeast Missouri, and southern Illinois. On October 10, 1945, Kentucky Dam was dedicated on a platform just below the powerful engineering success. President Harry S. Truman spoke at the dedication and summed up the success of TVA, "a formula comprised of modern science, good management, and common sense." A crowd of 15,000 gathered at the dam to hear the President speak. "the South and the Middle West of this Nation are now connected by water transportation. The benefits of this dam go not only to the Tennessee Valley; they go to Saint Paul and Minneapolis, to New Orleans and Memphis, to Saint Louis and Kansas City, to Omaha and Sioux City - to all the communities of the great Mississippi Valley that is served by our inland waterways."

Rumor has it that during President Truman's visit, he had dinner at the Draffen's home in Calvert City. This was confirmed by Sue Draffen. "I remember we had hot dogs cooked over the fire pit in the back yard."

INDUSTRIAL BOOM

Luther Draffen didn't cease in his forward way of thinking. He knew that the power from the new dam could generate far more electricity needed for the residents. He, along with Charles Hall, wrote roughly 1,000 letters to industries across the United States, and in 1949, their diligence paid off. Pennsylvania Salt Company opened and shortly thereafter, other industries followed, turning Calvert City into one of the largest industrial centers in the Southeast.


Pennsylvania Salt Company, now Arkema, celebrated its 70th Anniversary at Calvert City in 2019. Arkema along with Ashland, Evonik Corporation, Carbide Industries, Cymetech Corporation, Estron Chemical, Lubrizol Advanced Materials, Sekisui Specialty, Wacker, Westlake, and Clean Earth provide highwage, high-demand jobs for our community and our region.

LIONS CLUB

The Benton Lions Club chartered the Calvert City Lions Club in 1948. About the same time, women in the community established the Calvert City Woman's Club, now defunct. Both clubs often worked together on community projects.

Lions organized the volunteer fire department and helped fund the first fire truck; made recommendations to the city council for naming city streets and establishing a grid for house numbers; purchased and installed street signs; helped establish the first street signs; organized the United Fund Drive in 1953 to persuade all agencies to participate and eliminate separate drives; and helped organize the Jaycees. With the Woman's Club jointly started the first public library in Calvert City; helped organize a band at North Marshall High School and the football program; raised funds for band instruments and football uniforms; and provided eye care assistance to those in need.

Ongoing Lions' projects and fundraisers are: sight preservation including financial assistance to qualifying local patients for eye care and eyeglasses; a sponsor of the Louisville Lions Eye Foundation, the Leader Eye Dog Program, Camp Crescendo Youth Camps, the Youth Reading Action Program and scholarships.

TELEPHONE COMPANY

Marion and Grace Denfip and five of their children were not natives of Marshall County, but in September 1941, left the Illinois and moved to Calvert City. The family relocated because Marion needed steady employment to support his family, and since Kentucky Dam was under construction at the time, he felt confident he could find work in Calvert City. In 1944, Kentucky Dam was completed and Marion needed a new job. Grace had heard talk that the Calvert City Telephone Company was going to be sold soon. It was co-owned by Luther Draffen and Lawrence Solomon.

The Denfip's purchased the Calvert City Telephone Company in 1944 for \$50. They hired Marguerette Schmidt, wife of Draffen Schmidt, to be the switchboard operator. When the Denfips purchased the system there were only 12 subscriber lines. They operated out of a small frame house located on 2nd Ave.

In 1946, Marion and Grace moved their family and the company again. This time was only a block away on 1st street. At the time, the telephone company didn't have an office. It was operated out of the their home and the switchboard was located in the living room. The cost of the actual telephone was \$32 and the rates for the customers were \$1.00 per month for residential and \$1.50 per month for commercial or business. It took the company over a year to recover the cost of the phone on a residential account and 22 months on a commercial account.

It was said that Grace could remember everyone's telephone number on the system. She was also considered a personal secretary to a Dr. William Colburn. She always knew where he was and how he could be reached.

On March 24, 1954, Marion and Grace Denfip sold the Calvert City Telephone Company to Calvert Telephone Systems, Inc.

LEE COX

Lee Cox's service to Calvert City didn't end with his death. When his will was probated December 21, 1950, he left \$100,000 to the American Bible Society. The remainder of his considerable real estate holding and cash were bequeathed to the city to build the Lee Cox Memorial Hospital. The hospital was "to be built on the property known as the 'old Finley place,' located on the WPA (Works Progress Administration) road (now 5th Ave) just east of Calvert City." The WPA was a New Deal program of President Franklin Delano Roosevelt to provide work for unemployed men during the Great Depression of the 1930's. Cox authorized real estate agent H. Vernon Duckett, with Mert Draffen's supervision, to handle the sale of his real and personal property.

Though a hospital was never built, the Calvert City Convalescent Center opened on Cox land in 1973 and Cox Manor Apartments built later. Also built on Cox's land is the Calvert branch of the Marshall County Public Library, the Civic Center, the skate park, City Hall, basketball courts, and the ball fields. Cox's land was also the location of the Calvert City Clinic.

Though a hospital was never built, On January 12, 1958, Dr. Traylor announced pending construction – a clinic first, later to expand to a hospital. Traylor had located here in 1956, and the clinic opened in September 1, 1962 housing the offices of Drs. William J. Colburn, Traylor, and Richard I. Cocke.


DOCTORS OF CALVERT CITY

From the 1950s through the 1980s, Drs. Colburn, Traylor, and Cocke practiced in Calvert City. A few years after those doctors located here, Dr. Gary Smith opened his dental practice on 5th Avenue between Main and Cedar streets. Soon after graduating from dental school in 1995, Dr. Barry Wilson joined Dr. Smith's practice.

Still later, Dr. Colburn's son, Dr. Richard Colburn, and Dr. Cocke's son, Dr. Rick Cocke, also a dentist, practiced in Calvert City. Dr. Rick Cocke's son, Dr. Nick Cocke, a dentist, has his office here on Industrial Parkway just off Fifth Avenue.

Dr. Ben Leonard, an optometrist practices here now. He joined Dr. J.P. Lyles' practice of optometry in 2013 in the same building complex as Dr. Nick Cocke. Dr. Leonard acquired the practice after Dr. Lyles' untimely death July 2, 2014. Calvert City Chiropractic has treated patients since 1959. Dr. Bradley A. Tack and his wife, Dr. Lisa A. Tack are the current chiropractors.


In 2017, Dr. Ashley Jessup, a physician, joined Baptist Health Medical Group Family Medicine on U.S. 62 in Calvert City.

CALVERT CITY FIRE DEPARTMENT

Under leadership from Ed Rendleman, a jewelry store owner and Lions' member, the Calvert City Volunteer Fire Department was organized January 18, 1951. Rendleman was named fire chief with Randal Stringer, assistant chief. The Lions Club sponsored a drive to raise \$10,000 to pay for a fire truck. Two years ago, that truck was restored and stands witness to the city's progress in firefighting and prevention.

The Calvert City Volunteer Fire Department has only seen three chiefs in the 70 years of operation. Ed Rendleman's son-in-law, Fred Ross stepped in as chief and held the position until he retired in 2019 completing 50 years of service.

Timmy Davis spent 35 years as an Emergency Medical Technician for Marshall County and became Calvert City's third fire chief in 2019. "I wasn't on the fire department, I was just a punk kid. I went down to the barn, just to be nosy, and the fire was nearly out. Lowell O'Daniel put me and my brother to work." From that point on he was hooked. Timmy knew exactly how he could contribute to his community. He and his brother joined the fire department together after that night.

The Fire Department is very active in Calvert City. They provide fire safety classes to students at Calvert City Elementary School and participate in Halloween and Ameribration festivities as well as the Christmas Parade.





ROLLING HILLS SHOPPING CENTER

On October 9, 1958, blacktopping of Fifth Avenue between Main and Hickory streets began. Rolling Hills Shopping Plaza on Fifth Avenue and Hickory Street, opened in October 1965. It housed a supermarket, jewelry store, men's clothing store, women and children's ready to wear shop, coin laundry, card and gift shop and real estate and insurance offices. An addition in 1977 provided space for a barber shop, beauty salon, drug store, and a hardware store.

Today it houses Calvert City Food Giant, Calvert City Insurance, China Wall, Control Specialists, Basket Case Florist and Gifts, Calvert City Pharmacy, Jackson Hewitt, SNAP Fitness, Studio 270, Rockstar Media, Tan Lines, New Dimensions Salon, a massage business, and Shop-o-Rama.

JAYCEES CIVIC ORGANIZATION

The Calvert City Jaycees were organized December 18, 1961 with five men attending the organizational meeting. By the January 28, 1962 meeting, the membership had grown to 26. The Jaycees conducted their charter banquet February 26, 1962, and two years later, 1964, the Jaycees built the Civic Center on Lee Cox land with volunteer labor.

The Jaycettes, wives of Jaycee members, were organized soon after the men's group. After the Civic Center was completed, the Jaycees and Jaycettes began hosting teen dances on Saturday nights. The organizations no longer exist here.

CALVERT CITY PUBLIC LIBRARY

In the 1960s, the need for a public library became apparent, and on September 10, 1962, the city authorized the Lions Club and the Woman's Club to convert an old building on Main Street into a library. The library moved to the Main Street shopping center in January 1968.

In 2008, the Marshall County Library Board built a new home for its Calvert City branch off Fifth Avenue at the entrance to Doctor's Park, and relocated the library operation from the basement of City Hall into the new building.



CENTENNIAL CELEBRATION - 1971

In 1971, Calvert City citizens joined forces to celebrate the city's Centennial anniversary with a three-day festival June 18-20. Mayor William Colburn chaired the event with Luther Draffen as honorary chairman. Lee Dietsch, vice president of First Liberty Bank, coordinated a 35-member committee of citizen volunteers to plan and run the celebration. The city's observance of its first 100 years included a parade, fireworks, street dances, Centennial Ball, beard contest, costume contest, antique gun show, merchants displays, fiddlers competition and street carnival.

CALVERT CITY GOLF & COUNTRY CLUB

Calvert City Golf & Country Club opened in the May 1970 with its 18-hole golf course, Olympic Size swimming pool and clubhouse. It was built on a farm Mayor William Colburn acquired from Henry Smith and lies off Fifth Avenue between Oak Park Boulevard and Lone Valley Road. The Harold England designed course is 6679 yards from the back tees and 3574 yards from the front tees. The par 72 layout consists of Mini Verde Ultra Dwarf Bermuda Grass greens and lush carpet-like El Toro Zoysia grass fairways with five teeing areas, several sand bunkers and lakes that come into play on several holes. A natural creek runs near seven of the holes, not only challenging the golfer but also offering a view of Calvert City's wetlands and wildlife.

CALVERT CITY BASEBALL FIELDS


Recreation Association leaders began a drive to have its baseball teams associated with a sanctioned league such as the nationally known Little League. Ray Foust Jr., association president, began negotiations with Little League authorities but was unable to obtain sanction for Calvert City teams because Benton already held the Little League franchise for Marshall County. He immediately contacted Boys Baseball Inc., and obtained sanction from that nationally acclaimed organization for T-ball, Bronco League, Pony League and Colt League teams in Calvert City.

Because of a growing number of youths wanting to play baseball in a sanctioned league, the one field and facilities at Old Park on Fifth Avenue proved inadequate. So, Foust designed a four-baseball field complex with a concession stand and press box in the center, had an artist concept drawn, and presented it to Mayor William Colburn. Foust asked that the complex be built on city owned property off Fifth Avenue between the railroad and the clinic. Colburn liked the idea, asked for the city council's approval and asked Kean McKinney, his representative on the Purchase Area Development District, to find a federal grant to pay for the complex.

McKinney obtained a \$50,000, 50/50 matching grant from the Federal Bureau of Outdoor Recreation. The city's portion of the grant could be paid in part through "in-kind" labor and donations. Recreation Association members and many businesses, including Riley Electric and Calvert Lumber, donated money, materials and labor, and the complex was ready for play by the 1972 season. The Recreation Association hosted several state and regional Bronco League, Pony League and Colt League sanctioned tournaments at the new baseball complex in the 1970s.



CALVERT AREA DEVELOPMENT ASSOCIATION


In 1988, a group of local citizens, with the city's endorsement and assistance, organized a citywide festival they called Homecoming '88 over the Fourth of July weekend. Loyd Ford, who had long lobbied the city to establish a festival on Independence Day, had hoped the homecoming would evolve into such an event. It didn't. However, about the same time, Ford and other business owners, decided to organize a group to promote the city in different ways including a festival on the Fourth of July.

The Calvert Area Development Association was born in late 1989. CADA then sponsored Freedom Fest on July 4, 1990, but Murray also had an event on the same day that it dubbed Freedom Fest. Someone in Murray objected to Calvert using the name. So CADA members brainstormed and came up with a new name for its observance — AmeriBration. It is the only festival so named in this region, and has been conducted annually since 1990 except 2020 when it was canceled because of the coronavirus pandemic.

CADA plans many events in Calvert City. Some of those events include Kites Over Calvert, Calvert City Christmas Bazaar and the Calvert City Fall Fun Fest.











LADY MARSHALS

In 1982, Howard Beth of Calvert City, coached his Marshall County High School Lady Marshals basketball team to the Kentucky State Girls Basketball Championship played at Eastern Kentucky University in Richmond. His team was the state runner-up in 1981. And in 1984, the Lady Marshals did it again becoming state champions of Kentucky high school-girl basketball. The 1984 Lady Marshals were the last Marshall County High School basketball players to win a state championship. Beth's son, Aaron Beth, led his 2021 team of Lady Marshals to finals of the state championship. They lost 49-47 to Sacred Heart Academy in the nail-biting final seconds.











WCCK RADIO

In 1990 Dwayne Stice, a lifelong Calvert citizen and manager of the Paducah Area Transit System, organized a corporation to establish a radio station in Calvert City. His partners were Doris Stice, King Stice, Elaine Hale and Stan Walton. "We received a construction permit in April 1993, and we signed on the air August 24, 1993," Stice said. Stice ran the station for seven years before selling to Freeland Broadcasting owned by Jim Freeland on August 1, 2000. Stice later accepted a position with WPSD Channel 6 in Paducah. He is retired from Channel 6 and is now a funeral director with Collier Funeral Home.

Freeland Broadcasting also owns WCBL in Benton. Stice and his associates' intent in founding WCCK was, "first to serve the community." Their aim was to meet the needs "peculiar to Calvert City, that could be met on a more detailed basis than they had been in the past." He also wanted to provide quality entertainment and to be a source of news and public safety. The call letters stand for Calvert City Kentucky, and its format was easy-listening beautiful music. The station was affiliated with CBS Radio News.

The station continues to serve the city and environs from its studio housed in a historic building on the corner of Aspen Street and Railroad Avenue

CALVERT CITY MEMORIAL PARK


The first section of Memorial Park between Fifth and Seventh avenues, opened in the early 1990s. The first leg of the walking/biking trail was built soon thereafter.

The city hired John Ward to succeed Richard Nash as city administrator in December 2004. Nash was city administrator from 1990 to 2004 when he retired. He had been president of the Kentucky City Managers Association from 1997 through 1999. After retiring, Nash continued to serve on the planning commission for several years. He was an Owensboro native and previously was employed by the cities of Murray, Princeton and Paducah. He died in 2012.

The first city project after Ward arrived was finishing construction of the amphitheater in Memorial Park. Memorial Park Amphitheater has restroom facilities and electric service to the stage. The stage itself is covered to protect performers from the elements, elevated and approximately 1400 square feet. It is fronted by 4100 square foot decorative concrete skirting. Take notice of the benches as you walk through the park. Each bench was purchased by loved ones who passed away. This is a way to honor former citizens of Calvert City.

5TH AVENUE

In 2001, the state Transportation Cabinet resurfaced and widened Fifth Avenue to three lanes, which provided a turn lane from the highly traveled street. The upgrade was proposed and promised during Julian Carroll's Administration from 1975 through 1979. John Y. Brown Jr. succeeded Carroll in December 1979. Carroll served an extra year as governor because Gov. Wendell Ford was elected to the U.S. Senate in 1974, and Carroll, as lieutenant governor, finished Ford's term while campaigning to succeed him.

CHRIS BYNUM SKATE PARK

The city's skate park — named for the late comedian, radio personality, and Calvert City Councilman Chris Bynum — was built in 2005. His family bought and erected a memorial monument bearing the name, "Chris Bynum Skate Park," which was dedicated on July 3, 2005. "Measure his life not in years lived but in hearts he touched," reads the inscription on the memorial stone at the Chris Bynum Skate Park.

Bynum was in his first term on the city council when he died in a tragic accident. His ambition was to become the city's mayor someday. He was a beloved performer — both as singer and in comedy where he portrayed "Avis P. Broomlick," which he described as a "country version of Elvis." Bynum performed regularly at the Nashville Palace. A part of his performance there was singing "The Lion Sleeps Tonight," which always brought down the house in applause.

CALVERT CITY CEMETERY


In the last decade, the city took control of Calvert City Cemetery, renovating and beautifying the graveyard and adding a columbarium, water fountain and block wall.

CALVERT CITY MULTI-USE TRAIL

In the last half of Gov. Steve Beshear's Administration, Beshear and Mayor Lynn Jones worked out a plan to beautify the U.S. 62 corridor turning it into a boulevard with a walking/biking trail next to it between Interstate-24, Exit 27 and Kentucky Dam Village State Resort Park. Construction began in 2015. Beshear's successor, Gov. Matt Bevin, added funding and the corridor was completed in 2020. The trail will connect the center of Calvert City to Kentucky Dam Village State Resort Park.

KENTUCKY DAM AIRPORT

The city annexed Kentucky Dam Village State Resort Park in 2014, including Kentucky Dam Airport. Since then, it has annexed land west to McFarlin Road and south to Old Calvert City Road on the west side of 15th Avenue. The city took control of the airport in 2018 and hired a consultant to assist with its upgrading including recertification by the Federal Aviation Administration, repaving the runway, installing a new aircraft and jet fuel system and building two new T-hangars. The work is ongoing in conjunction with the state, which paid about \$3 million of the cost. All hangars are rented.

CALVERT CITY TENNIS AND PICKLEBALL

The city took over tennis courts on Fifth Avenue south of the country club after receiving a land and water conservation grant. The city raised the court, resurfaced it, and put in new lighting and new electrical wiring. Also added to the court was striping for pickleball.

The Calvert City Pickleball Team started small and now has over 20 players waiting to play on the courts. Because of this, the Calvert City Council agreed to install four new pickleball courts. These courts will be built next to the Chris Bynum Skate Park.

DAVE CHUMBLER BASKETBALL COURTS

On December 11, 2017, Calvert City Council recognized David Chumbler, a regular player on the city's basketball courts since they were built. He also is a mentor and an informal volunteer instructor of all youths who play with him on the courts. The mayor said the council was recognizing Chumbler "for inspiring countless youths and adults through his dedication to sports." The city also installed a marker with Chumbler's image etched on it. The inscription reads: "In tribute to David Chumbler whose passion for sports has inspired practice, patience and perseverance."

Chumbler, who attended the meeting responded: "I appreciate it Mr. Lynn Jones. I really appreciate what you all have said. I really like my rock" (the marker).




